

2022 BEEF Check-list

Contact Uinta County Fair Office with any questions 789-4785

- Review all information on pages: 1-5, 6, 21, 59-62
- You must be signed up with 4-H or FFA in this project area/class in order to show market beef
- If you are going to sell a 4-H animal through the Uinta County Jr. Livestock Sale, you must complete a Quality Assurance Training through 4-H
- Market beef must be owned by exhibitor **AND** tagged with a Wyoming State Fair (WSF) tag by February 1st
 - These tags may be picked up from either the 4-H Office -or- your FFA Advisor, depending on which group you will be showing under
 - For every tag received, a description must be submitted including: exhibitor name, specific animal breed, gender, and color/markings ****NO EXCEPTIONS****
- You must inform your 4-H Club Leader or FFA Advisor of a need for a tie-out for your market beef before Friday, July 15th
- Any yearling heifers being brought to the Fairgrounds must have a Bangs tag/tattoo in the ear
- Health Inspections must be completed (**one form per exhibitor**) and signed by a veterinarian, by Wednesday, July 20th. Fair Staff will collect these directly from the Vets.
 - You may use either a Wyoming State Vet Inspection Form (\$25) -or- a Uinta County Fair Health Inspection Form (\$10)
 - Uinta County Health Inspection Forms may be picked up from your 4-H Club Leader -or- your FFA Advisor, depending on which group you will be showing under
- Exhibitors must be signed up for Uinta County Fair **ONLINE** at: uintacountyfair.org by Wednesday, July 20th
 - You will need to sign up for each individual class you wish to show in (ie: market beef, 4-H/FFA Showmanship, Pen of Three market beef, breeding beef, etc.)
 - You will receive an emailed receipt of all your entries. If you do not receive one, please contact the Fair Office to verify entries
- You must enter **ALL** tag numbers (WSF) correctly online or your entry will not be accepted
- Weigh-ins for market beef will only be from 8:30 - 9:30 AM Tuesday, August 2nd at the beef barn scale
 - Market beef must be a minimum weight of 1050 pounds at weigh-ins
- All Catch-It-Calf heifers must remain on grounds from market beef weigh-ins through release time at 4:00 PM Saturday, August 6th
- All Cow-Calf pairs (including Catch-It-Calf pairs) must be on grounds between 4:00 - 6:00 PM Tuesday, August 2nd and remain on grounds until 4:00 PM Saturday, August 6th
- Market beef will be shown Thursday, August 4th immediately following showmanship (which will begin at 9:00 AM)
- All breeding beef must be on grounds by 1:00 PM Thursday, August 4th
 - Breeding beef will be shown beginning at 1:00 PM Thursday, August 4th
 - Breeding beef will be released immediately following the open show
- A Junior Livestock Sale Declaration form must be completed, signed by both the exhibitor and a parent, and returned to the Fair Office by 5:00 PM Thursday, August 4th
- You must secure a brand inspection on your market animal to submit prior to the start of the Jr. Livestock Sale Friday, August 5th
- All animals must be fed and bedded following the sale Friday, August 5th
- All market beef must be taken home and fed back for 10 days following fair or until slaughter date set by owner, whichever is first
- All market beef exhibitors should set a processing date with either Henderson Meats or High Country Meats that is after their 10 day feed back.
- All market beef returning home must remain on grounds until exhibit release time at 4:00 PM Saturday, August 6th
- All exhibitors must check with Livestock Sale Committee before leaving Saturday, August 6th to ensure none of your animals will be left on grounds following Fair
- All pens must be completely cleaned out Saturday, August 6th prior to leaving the Fairgrounds
