

2021 Poultry Check-list

Contact Uinta County Fair Office with any questions 789-4785

Review all information on pages: 1-5, 15, 26, 57-60

You must be signed up with 4-H or FFA in this project area/class in order to show your poultry

If you are going to sell a 4-H animal through the Uinta County Jr. Livestock Sale, you must complete a Quality Assurance Training through 4-H

Meat pen of three poultry must be hatched after Monday, March 1st and owned by the exhibitor no later than Saturday, May 15th

Members must own and use their own poultry

You must inform your 4-H Club Leader or FFA Advisor of a need for a pen for your poultry before Thursday, July 15th

Health Inspections must be completed (**one form per exhibitor**) and signed by a veterinarian, by 11:59 p.m. Monday, July 19th. Fair Staff will collect these directly from the Vets.

You may use either a Wyoming State Vet Inspection Form (\$25) -or- a Uinta County Fair Health Inspection Form (\$10)

Uinta County Health Inspection forms may be picked up from your 4-H Club Leader -or- your FFA Advisor, depending on which group you will be showing under

Exhibitors must be signed up for Uinta County Fair **ONLINE** at: uintacountyfair.org by 11:59 p.m. Monday, July 19th

You will need to sign up for each individual class you wish to show in (ie: meat pen of three broilers, 4-H/FFA Showmanship, etc.)

You will receive an emailed receipt of all your entries. If you do not receive one, please contact the Fair Office to verify entries

Weigh-ins for meat pen of three broilers will only be Tuesday, August 3rd at 11 a.m. at the rabbit/poultry barn scale

Meat pen poultry must be a minimum weight of 3.5 pounds at weigh-ins

Poultry showmanship will begin at 10 a.m. Wednesday, August 4th with meat pen of three immediately following

You must secure a bill of sale on your market animal to submit during weigh-ins Tuesday, August 3rd

A Junior Livestock Sale Declaration form must be completed, signed by both the exhibitor and a parent, and returned to the Fair Office by 5 p.m. Thursday, August 5th

All animals must be fed and bedded following the sale Friday, August 6th

All poultry must remain on grounds until exhibit release time at 3 p.m. Saturday, August 7th

All exhibitors must check with Livestock Sale Committee before leaving Saturday, August 7th to ensure none of your animals will be left on grounds following Fair

All pens must be completely cleaned out Saturday, August 7th prior to leaving the Fairgrounds
