

2022 SHEEP Check-list

Contact Uinta County Fair Office with any questions 789-4785

- Review all information on pages: 1-5, 18-19, 29, 59-62
- You must be signed up with 4-H or FFA in this project area/class in order to show market sheep
- If you are going to sell a 4-H animal through the Uinta County Jr. Livestock Sale, you must complete a Quality Assurance Training through 4-H
- Market lambs must be owned by the exhibitor **AND** tagged with a Wyoming State Fair (WSF) tag by June 1st
 - These tags may be picked up from either the 4-H Office -or- your FFA Advisor, depending on which group you will be showing under
 - For every tag received, a description must be submitted including: exhibitor name, specific animal breed, gender, and color/markings ****NO EXCEPTIONS****
- A USDA scrapie tag must be in the ear of every sheep prior to entering online and must remain in the ear throughout the duration of Fair
- You must inform your 4-H Club Leader or FFA Advisor of a need for a pen for your market lamb before Friday, July 15th
- Health Inspections must be completed (**one form per exhibitor**) and signed by a veterinarian, by Wednesday, July 20th. Fair Staff will collect these directly from the Vets.
 - You may use either a Wyoming State Vet Inspection Form (\$25) -or- a Uinta County Fair Health Inspection Form (\$10)
 - Uinta County Health Inspection forms may be picked up from your 4-H Club Leader -or- your FFA Advisor, depending on which group you will be showing under
- Exhibitors must be signed up for Uinta County Fair **ONLINE** at: uintacountyfair.org by Wednesday, July 20th
 - You will need to sign up for each individual class you wish to show in (ie: market lamb, 4-H/FFA Showmanship, Pen of Three market lambs, breeding sheep, etc.)
 - You will receive an emailed receipt of all your entries. If you do not receive one, please contact the Fair Office to verify entries
- You must enter **ALL** tag numbers (WSF & Scrapie) correctly online or your entry will not be accepted
- Weigh-ins for market sheep will only be from 9:30 - 11:00 AM Tuesday, August 2nd at the livestock barn scale
 - Market sheep must be a minimum weight of 100 pounds at weigh-ins
- Sheep showmanship will begin at 1:00 PM Wednesday, August 3rd with market lambs immediately following
- A Junior Livestock Sale Declaration form must be completed, signed by both the exhibitor and a parent, and returned to the Fair Office by 5:00 PM Thursday, August 4th
- You must secure a bill of sale on your market animal to submit during weigh-ins August 2nd
- All animals must be fed and bedded following the sale Friday, August 5th
- All breeding sheep must be on grounds by 12:00 PM Saturday, August 6th
- Breeding sheep showmanship will begin at 12:00 PM Saturday, August 6th and all other breeding sheep classes will follow
- All market lambs returning home must remain on grounds until exhibit release time at 4:00 PM Saturday, August 6th
- Breeding sheep will be released immediately following the show
- All exhibitors must check with Livestock Sale Committee before leaving Saturday, August 6th to ensure none of your animals will be left on grounds following Fair
- All pens must be completely cleaned out Saturday, August 6th prior to leaving the Fairgrounds
