

2024 GOAT Check-list

Contact Uinta County Fair Office with any questions 783-0314

- Review all information on pages: 23-27; 52-53
- You must be signed up with 4-H or FFA in this project area/class in order to show market goats
- If you are going to sell a 4-H animal through the Uinta County Jr. Livestock Sale, you must complete a Quality Assurance Training through 4-H
- Market goats must be owned by the exhibitor AND tagged with a Wyoming State Fair (WSF) tag by June 1st
- These tags may be picked up from either the 4-H Office -or- your FFA Advisor, depending on which group you will be showing under
- For every tag received, a description must be submitted including: exhibitor name, specific animal breed, gender, and color/markings **NO EXCEPTIONS**
- A USDA scrapie tag must be in the ear of every goat prior to entering online and must remain in the ear throughout the duration of Fair
- You must inform your 4-H Club Leader or FFA Advisor of a need for a pen for your market goat before Friday, July 15th
- Exhibitors must be signed up for Uinta County Fair ONLINE at: uinta.fairwire.org by **Monday, July 15th 11:59**
- You will need to sign up for each individual class you wish to show in (ie: market goat, 4-H/FFA Showmanship, Pen of Three market goats, breeding goat, etc.)
- You will receive an emailed receipt of all your entries. If you do not receive one, please contact the Fair Office to verify entries
- You must enter ALL tag numbers (WSF & Scrapie) correctly online or your entry will not be accepted
- You must secure a bill of sale on your market animal to submit during weigh-ins Tuesday, July 30th
- Weigh-ins for market goats will only be from 7:30 - 8:30 AM Tuesday, July 30th at the beef barn scale
- Market goats must be a minimum weight of 55 pounds at weigh-ins
- Market goat showmanship will begin at 8:00 AM Wednesday, July 31st with market goats immediately following
- A Junior Livestock Sale Declaration form must be completed, signed by both the exhibitor and a parent, and returned to the Fair Office by 5:00 PM Thursday, August 1st
- All animals must be fed and bedded following the sale Friday, August 2nd
- Breeding goat showmanship will begin at 9:00 AM Saturday, August 3rd and all other breeding goat classes will follow
- All other breeding goats must be on grounds by 9:00 AM Saturday, August 3rd
- Breeding goats will be released immediately following the show
- All market goats returning home must remain on grounds until exhibit release time at 3:00 PM Saturday, August 3rd
- All exhibitors must check with Livestock Sale Committee before leaving Saturday, August 3rd to ensure none of your animals will be left on grounds following Fair
- All pens must be completely cleaned out Saturday, August 5th prior to leaving the Fairgrounds
